In fact, their bond with you was very evident when they heard the news of your accident. They were deeply concerned for your well being and very relieved to hear you were unharmed.

Dear Ruth:

When I invited you to visit our school for a week during April, I thought I was inviting a musician who would spend a week with the students helping fill in the hole created by no music program at the school, We fill in with various consultants and teachers as we can.

What actually occurred, however, was beyond all expectations. You not only fulfilled your agreement to help the students write songs, sing, and engaged in a week of cooperative learning, but helped immeasurably to build their self-esteem and pride as Indians by their writing of the uranium songs.

I have worked with these students over the past six years and have seen them grow and develop, and have seen the sense of crushing hopelessness in them and in their people over the proposed uranium mining on the rim of the Canyon. They feel that their sacred ground is being violated and that they will be annihilated by the waste products. When the students told me about their pongs, and when I listened to them, I could see and feel a sense of self-sufficiency and ability to control their own destiny surging within them.

When you returned to sing at the graduation with them, I saw adults in the audience so moved that they were crying. These were also men, who do not cry easily and did not want me to see the looks on their faces. I saw and heard adults join in the singing, and these people do not easily do that. Also, at a time such as graduation, these songs helped to bring a focus to the future and some hope in that the students feel that perhaps they can continue on in their educations and have their voices count for something in the world.

I hope that in the future you will continue your visits to the Havasupai and further develop the wonderful work that you have started here. You have been able to use music as a vehicle to stir elements deep within these children that bring out some of their best qualities and help enable them to develop as the truly great people that they are and will become.

Dear Arts and Education Coordinator,

During the 2002-2003 school year, the tenth grade English Language Arts teachers at Watervliet High School decided to deepen their already committed study of the human tragedy of the Holocaust by exploring with students a number of other 20th century campaigns of ethnic genocidal violence.

In order to ensure that student's study would allow for thoughtful response, the teachers wrote a grant application to the Creative Connections Re-Grant Program entitled: <u>Voices of War: Visions of Peace</u> requesting funding for artists participation in the process. Singer/song-writer Ruth Pelham was hired through this grant.

Ruth's challenge was to both help teachers inform students about the tragedy of ethnic violence by recounting her personal experiences as an ambassador for peace in Sri Lanka as well as to help students create 5 songs which were class-based reflections on student's study of violence in Northern Ireland, the former Yugoslavia, Rwanda, Ireland, as well as the Holocaust study itself, songs which might be used as teaching tools for younger students. This was a daunting task given the darkness and seriousness of the material and the age of the student participants.

Ruth embraced this challenge. In each of five sections of English 10 classes, Ruth helped students grapple with the heart of the darkness they'd encountered, prodding and gently nudging them to discover core themes and working with them patiently, tirelessly to shape these into pieces that exhibited their own garnered understanding of others.

Ruth's patience, persistence and prescience were impressive. It was clear throughout the process that her commitment to the questions and issues raised by the material matched the teachers; her passion for peace, rationality and justice were evident at every turn. This integrity of purpose gave the students, their minds, their reflections, their fears and doubts served to model the very values under study.

Under Ruth's deft guidance and personal commitment, the end result was impressive: one hundred and ten 15 and 16 year olds singing songs of wisdom for each other, at a morning "Symposium for Peace." The songs were moving but the sense that hearts and minds had been engaged, with students and artist coming to community and mutual respect was even more so.

The patience, wisdom, depth of personal commitment, artistic talent, experience and flexibility of Ruth Pelham made this possible.
